Sub: Grant of fresh affiliation for 5 year B.A., LL.B (intake 60) and 5 year B.B.A., LL.B (intake 60) from the year 2018-19 to R.V Institute of Legal Studies, Bengaluru.

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With reference to the above, I am directed to convey approval of Government for fresh affiliation of 5 year B.A., LL.B (intake 60) and 5 year B.B.A., LL.B. (intake 60) from the year 2018-19 to R.V Institute of Legal Studies, NMKRV College for women Campus, 3<sup>rd</sup> Block, Jayanagar, Bengaluru-560011, subject to the following conditions:-

1. Capitation fee in any form should not be collected.
2. The College shall not seek any financial assistance in the nature of grant-in- aid from the Government and shall strictly function on "No Grants for ever" basis.
3. The College shall not infringe upon the norms and standards prescribed by the BCI, Karnataka State Law University and the Government from time to time.
4. Admission of students shall be strictly in accordance with the regulations of the Karnataka State Law University and the BCI.

5. The Principal and teaching staff of the College shall possess the requisite qualifications in law as stipulated by the Bar Council of India. The college shall not make any admissions or start imparting education in law before obtaining approval from the BCI as prescribed in Rule 14(1), (2) and (3) (Rules of Legal Education, Chapter III of Part IV) of the Bar Council of India Rules.
6. Before admitting students to a course, the college, shall send a copy of the approval documents issued to it by the BCI, to the Secretary to Government, Department of Law and the Registrar, Karnataka State Law University, Deviation of any sort will be viewed seriously and Government retains the right to unilaterally cancel the permission granted to the college.
7. The College should follow the Statutes/Rules/Regulations and Orders passed by the Karnataka State Law University from time to time in the interest of Students/Teachers/other employees of the College. The College should, under no circumstance, violate the eligibility criteria or exceed the intake of students prescribed in the affiliation orders of the University and shall fulfill all the conditions imposed by the LIC.
8. The college should follow the rules of the University in admitting 50% of the students under University quota (wherever applicable) with the fees fixed by the University from time to time and without charging any fee or amount over and above the fees fixed by the University.
9. The Management of the College has to note the Supreme Court order dated 13.8.1997 in Visakha Vs. State of Rajasthan with regard to any act of violence or sexual harassment of women at College/Work place by any student/ person including faculty which is a cognizable offence. Indulgence in such activities shall render liable for cancellation of admission and also render liable for punishment of such student/person. Further, the College/Management should undertake to establish a Complaints Committee for the abatement of the above offence as per the directions of the Supreme Court.
10. The College shall undertake to conduct the courses to the best advantage of the students development. The Principal/Management should treat the Students/Teaching community courteously during their stay in the college.
11. The College shall not withhold the marks cards/transfer certificates and other documents of the students unnecessarily and no additional amount, save for the fees prescribed by the University shall be demanded for the same.

12. The College, before seeking the approval of the Bar Council of India, shall have a minimum capital fund of Rupees Ten Lakhs to be kept in a Bank account in order to be used for any future exigencies and development of the college. The account is to be jointly operated by the Principal of the college with the Registrar of the University or his authorized agent.
13. Roster System (wherever applicable) should be followed at the time of admission of students.
14. All guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court; University Grant Commission; Ministry of Human Resource Development; Karnataka State Government and other stakeholders about measures to avoid the ragging menace in colleges should be strictly implemented.

You are requested to issue necessary Notification in this regard indicating the above conditions within 8 days from the date of receipt of this letter.
